Covid Team Recommendations

The Covid Team Recommends that the below changes take effect August 1, 2021

Communion

Pew Communion

- Communion Packets will be available at both services for those who would like to continue taking Communion in the pew.
- This option will be done prior to people coming forward for Communion.

8:00 AM Worship – Altar Communion

- Return Communion to what it was pre-Covid, but allow for 3ft social distancing at the altar between families. All those assisting with Communion (Pastor, Communion Assistant, usher) will wear masks.
 - An usher will hold a tray of empty cups.
 - Each person takes an empty cup.
 - The Pastor will place a wafer in each person's hand.
 - The Communion Assistant will fill the empty cups from the Chalice at the railing (a prefilled grape juice option will also be available).
 - A basket will be available for the empty cups.

9:30 AM Worship – Continuous Communion

- Normal Continuous Communion, but allow for 3ft social distancing between families. All those assisting with Communion (Pastor, Communion Assistant, usher) will wear masks.
 - An usher will hold a tray of empty cups.
 - Each person will take an empty cup.
 - The Pastor will place a wafer in each person's hand.
 - The Communion Assistant will fill empty cups from the Chalice (a prefilled grape juice option will also be available).
 - A basket will be available for the empty cups.

Singing

All those who are vaccinated may sing without wearing a mask.

Baptism

o Baptisms are allowed and will be celebrated during Worship as they were pre-Covid.

• First Communion

- The First Communion class will be held in the fall.
- The children will receive their First Communion during a Worship service and will follow the guidelines above for Communion.

Outside groups

- We will allow outside groups to use our facility.
- We will ask that all non-vaccinated members of the group continue to wear masks.
- We will ask that all members of the group maintain 3 feet social distancing.
- We will advise all groups that scheduled meetings may need to be canceled if case counts rise.
