YOUNGER CHILDREN RECEIVING THE WAFER ONLY DURING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion is a sacred meal in which Christ comes to us in, with, and under the bread and wine to nourish the faith of Christians and the church. Christ is truly present in Holy Communion. We share in a sacred meal that spans all time and space. The uncontainable presence, grace, love, forgiveness, and mercy of Christ come to us in simple bread and wine.

In the ELCA, the norm is for baptized Christians to receive the sacrament, as this is a Christian sacrament that nourishes and strengthens faith in Christ. It is also the norm for Christians to receive instruction before receiving the sacrament and to continue reflecting on and learning about the sacrament throughout their lives as Christians.

At ELC Waynesboro, we offer First Communion instructions to all baptized children who have entered second grade. An age requirement reflects the church's desire for those receiving the sacrament to examine themselves and understand what they are receiving. However, such examination and understanding are a part of ongoing, life-long education and faith formation.

What about the children who are younger than the second grade who would like to receive only the wafer during Communion, but have not yet received First Communion instructions? Many Lutheran churches allow children to receive the wafer to help them feel included. The wafer is received without the words,

"Body of Christ given for you", which means this is not a Holy Communion, but rather an act of inclusion and love of all children of God, regardless of their age.

If families would like their younger children to receive the wafer during Holy Communion, please notify the pastor or a communion assistant. If you have any questions about Holy Communion, please speak with one of the pastors.

CHURCH PICNIC IS SEPTEMBER 7TH




