From the Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from Jesus Christ, our Lord. It feels almost surreal that the whole transition period, at least the logistical part, is already behind us. It was quite a journey, including calling Pastor Rosalie and hiring the remaining staff: Becky McDonald as business manager, Hayley Martz as secretary and children's ministry coordinator, and Bobbi Kelso as the youth director. I feel really blessed to have such a wonderful team to work with and to serve God here at ELC and Waynesboro Community. As we look forward, celebrating the past, we are also asking, what's next?

The church council met last month for a council retreat, discussing the survey results from the call process. We looked at what the surveys said about our core strengths, hopes, and longings, and healthy tensions. Among our core strengths, our congregation highlighted pastoral leadership, a strong sense of welcome and belonging, and youth and children's ministry. These are the foundations of our identity as a congregation. Among our hopes and longings, a strong desire for continued growth, deeper discipleship, and more community outreach was expressed. These are areas of great potential and future ministries. And among healthy tensions, things that were expressed were worship style, change versus stability, and politics. These are things the congregation expressed not necessarily to be fixed, but to be held in careful balance.

The council had looked at all the answers with patient discernment, and we had meaningful conversations about what these surveys are saying about our current state of ministries and the future ahead of us. Every congregation has to navigate the changing world, adapting its Gospel mission to new challenges and opportunities. It is our hope to continue together with the council and the whole congregation to explore and discern the ways God is calling us to grow and to serve. Among the first initiatives we're looking at is small-group ministry. It will help our community of faith build deeper relationships with one another, grow in faith and discipleship, and discern ways we can reach our neighbors.

During Lent, we'll explore ways to meaningfully implement small groups, engaging all ages in intentional discipleship, and empowering our community of faith to be a living witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. I can't wait to see what God has in place for us in this upcoming year.

rice, dehydrated vegetables and nutrient packets into bags, weighed them, sealed them and packed them into boxes, it was clear the theme of "Better Together" came to life in our youth. Thank you to everyone at ELC who continue to support opportunities like Winterfest for our

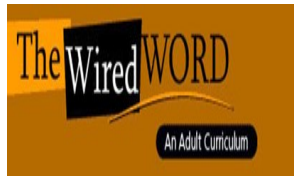

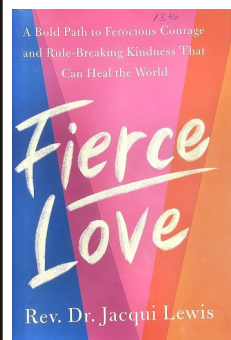


WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY

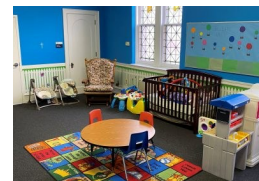
VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

- ◆Tea ◆Oatmeal

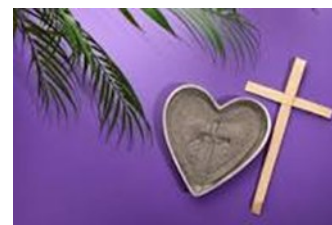
All food items will be donated to Waynesboro Community and Human Services to help the less fortunate.
